4. **Applications:**

All campers and staff must apply in advance. The fee for campers is **\$150 per camper OR \$200 per camper if submitted after due date**. There is not fee for Staff.

Deadline for applications is July 1st Neither space nor camp t-shirts are guaranteed after this date.

5. **Staff:**

We require a sizable staff (clergy and laity) to operate the camp in an effective and safe manner. There will be a minimum of 2 counselors per cabin.

Staff applications are required for all adults in attendance. In accordance with OCA PSPs, a Youth Volunteer Application (including **background checks**) must be completed and on file in your home parish.

The most important and valuable role for Camp Staff is to serve as cabin counselor. Additionally, talented staff are utilized in the following areas: kitchen, medical/nursing arts & crafts, sports, music, canoeing, campfire, etc. Additional programs may be offered depending on staff expertise, so please indicate any special skills or interests on the staff application.

6. Activities:

Swimming, sports, canoeing, hiking, arts & crafts, campfires, etc.

A general code of good behavior will be announced at the opening session. Severe behavioral problems will be dealt with in consultation with parents/legal guardians and parish priests.

7. Cabins:

Cabins are furnished with bunk beds (*bring your own sleeping bag and pillow*).

8. What to Bring:

- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Towel, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, comb/brush
- Changes of clothes including long pants, sweater and/or jacket (waterproof), sturdy tennis shoes or boots, extra shoes. *Because of the climate, camp can be rainy and wet. It is advisable to pack an extra pair of shoes or even rain boots to keep your child's feet dry.*
- Modest (one-piece) swimsuit and towel
- Bug spray, flashlight, sunscreen
- Water bottle (all campers and staff are strongly encouraged to keep water bottles with them and stay hydrated)
- Bible, notebook, writing utensil

All clothing and swimwear are to be modest and appropriate. Staff and volunteers are asked not to wear shorts/skirts that go above the knees.

No electronic devices (cellphones, i-pods, i-pads, etc.). *Those discovered will be confiscated and returned at the end of camp.*

No spending money is necessary.

Please mark personal items with your name.

Please be sure all prescription drugs are taken home with you at the end of camp.

9. Transportation:

Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of each camper's parent and/or parish.

Arrive between 3:00pm and 5:00pm Monday (dinner at 5:00pm).

Pickup between 1:30pm and 2:30pm Thursday (lunch at noon)
